## CULVER IS PROUD TO ANNOUNCE THE 2022 GRADUATE OF THE YEAR JANE DOEHRMAN EBERLY '73



If you have ever seen a trained dancer perform, one can't help but marvel at the fluidity of motion, the grace of the forms.

If you've ever tried to learn dance, you would find, obviously, that you don't go from zero to 60 in that first lesson, but rather start with steps and movements that seem fairly simple, and you may wonder, "How does this end up in a composed dance?"

The beginning may not resemble the end, but it's important that the foundation is there.

Jane Doehrman Eberly '73 knows about dance. She was among the first dance students at the newly-formed Culver Academy for Girls in 1971. And as she looks back at how far Culver Girls Academy has come in the past 50 years, she finds dance an apt comparison.

As she reflected on the past 50 years of CGA's history in preparation for Reunion Weekend, where she will be honored as the 2022 Graduate of the Year on Friday, she said she felt overwhelmed with how far CGA, and CMA along with it, has come.

What would she say to so many students who, in her opinion, have surpassed what she remembers doing at Culver on a regular basis?

"None of us had ever gone to a brand-new school," she says. "It was exciting, it felt powerful.

"Each new generation took something simple and grew it into something much more meaningful," she says. "They've certainly built the traditions to be stronger.

"I just feel in awe of what the students have expanded and grown" she says, thinking back to her time at Culver, which, she adds, at first blush seemed so small. "It doesn't seem as powerful as what I've seen the young women and men create now."

But the beginnings were there, those first steps, and with the proper attention, the "all-in" effort, these things can grow beyond those early imaginings.

"We really need to be stewards of Culver," she says. "That's our privilege as alums."

*Celebrating 50 Years  
of Culver Girls Academy*

## CULVER DAUGHTERS



The opening of the Culver Academy for Girls (today's Culver Girls Academy) in the fall of 1971 represented a remarkable moment in history, generating a uniquely *coordinate*, rather than simply coeducational, program in partnership with one of the nation's premier secondary educational programs: Culver Military Academy.

This half century milestone is a perfect time to celebrate the past and look forward to the possibilities of the future. The graduation of the young women in the Class of 1972 under the guidance and leadership of Dean Mary Frances England and her staff marked a significant change that has borne fruit that was un-foreseen and unimagined by even the most ardent visionaries and advocates at that time.

Over the last 50 years, our CAG and CGA students have molded and shaped our school as they have developed the voice that Dean England encouraged

them to have. CGA is never static. It grows and changes with the ideas, proposals, suggestions, and guidance of our students in attendance.

This weekend is the culmination of our yearlong celebration of Culver Girls Academy, and the experiences you've had are all threads in the tapestry (appropriately plaid, of course) that is CGA's story.

That story, especially of the founding of CGA and the extraordinary growth of opportunities and successes for women in leadership at Culver Academies, has never before been told in book-length form, and provides a complement to the earlier history of women at Culver, Mary Frances England's "Culver Daughters Sing Thy Praise," which concluded its story in 1971. ## CULVER'S DYNAMIC CAMPUS

**You will note many changes to the campus since your last reunion. We look forward to you enjoying these enhancements to the Culver campus upon your return in the future.**

Construction is complete on **Roberts Barrack**. The new **Lauridsen Barrack** is nearing completion. Roberts Barrack is between North/East Barracks and Fleet Gymnasium. Lauridsen Barrack is between the Lay Dining Center and the Music & Art Building. This is part of a longer-term plan to consolidate and improve living spaces for CSSC, CGA and CMA students. The next phase will see the start of construction this summer on **Roberts Academic Quadrangle**. This project, thanks to a \$65 million gift from George Roberts '62, includes the construction of a new Main Barrack as well as new North and East Barracks.

The **Schrage Leadership Center** includes new spaces for classes large and small and is a transformative enhancement to Culver's leadership program. It is situated on the west end of campus, on the former site of the Culver Motels.

Construction is in full swing on **Eagle Stadium** at **Oliver Field** and **Mendelson Track**. This will be a welcome addition to our athletic programs, with concession stands, locker rooms, and enclosed rooms for special events.

The **Paul Pigott Center for Advanced Technology and Design** is Culver's new innovation space for design and advanced technology. Opened in October 2017, the Pigott Center invites students and faculty members to design, collaborate, and prototype concepts during the academic day as well as during CQ. Designed with movable furniture, white boards, Surface Hubs, glass walls, and wireless speakers, the open and adaptable floorplan makes thinking easily visible. In the hard fabrication space, students and faculty use 3D printers, a laser engraver, Raspberry Pis, Little Bits, and various other pieces of technology to enhance their learning processes through projects.

We added a new **Nature Pavilion** at Woodcraft Camp in 2018.

To meet the health needs of so many young people, the **Waterfield Health Center** opened at Woodcraft Camp in 2018. The new facility greatly expands the space and equipment available for medical staff to treat the health needs of campers quickly and effectively in comfort and privacy.



**Memorial Chapel** has undergone a significant restoration and renovation. Roof repairs, storm window installation, tuck pointing and HVAC installation helps preserve the Chapel from the ravages of the elements it is especially subject to because of its grand and significant position overlooking Culver's campus.

**Harbor Dormitory** opened in 2016 in the **Julius W. Hegeler II Wing** at the south end of **Argonne Dormitory** to begin consolidating CGA and Upper Schools living space, allowing for more girls' residences on the main campus. This is part of a longer-term plan to consolidate and improve living spaces for CSSC, CGA and CMA students.

**Culver's Golf Course** has been restored to its original, historic design. Not only is the course open for play, but construction has been completed on a new **Golf House**. The course was designed in the 1920s by renowned golf course architects William Langford and Theodore Moreau. Culver's course is the only example of their nine-hole courses that remains true to their original vision and design. The course was renovated to restore its original layout and make it a top-notch teaching course for Culver golfers.

**The Huffington Library** has been significantly renovated and improved, with a new entrance at ground level that improves access to the building but enhances the grand façade of one of the jewels of the academic campus, as well as upgrades to the interior to improve the study environment.

New cabins have been built at **Woodcraft Camp**. Increases in the number of girls at camp have swelled the ranks of the Butterflies and Cardinals, making the new cabins necessary.

The new **Julius W. Hegeler II Foundation Scouting Headquarters** is also ready for Woodcraft campers.

A new **Leadership & Character Development Arena** has been built next to the **Vaughn Equestrian Center**. In addition to providing paddock space, it is used for classroom space in the summer. Also among improvements in the Horsemanship Department, a new fence has been installed around the **CSM John W. "Sarge" Hudson Black Horse Troop Pasture** at State Roads 10 and 17.
